Weekly Themed Camp Sessions for 2020

All The World's a Stage June 29th – July 3rd

Step into the limelight as we spend this week enjoying the performing arts. We will practice basic stage acting, character development, and movement. We also explore the London scene from the historic Globe theatre to the modern West End blockbusters. Our trip this week will take us backstage at Hartford Stage or another regional theater.

Mona Lisa Smile July 6th – July 10th

Visit the Great Masters as we immerse ourselves in the fine arts. Try your hand at some painting, sculpture or mosaic. We will learn a bit about Paris and make a plan for what we'd like to see at the Louvre. Our trip this week will take us to The Wadsworth Atheneum or other museums and galleries.

A Week to Marimba July 13th – July 17th

Turn it up the volume this week, when our focus is on making music. We will learn about instruments and maybe build some, too. Everyone who loves music is invited. We will take a special look at the music and instruments of Mexico and Central America. Our trip this week will take us to see a live music performance along with a visit backstage to meet the musicians.

Sounds Like Fun July 20th – July 24th

Discover wild things that live in (or near) Long Island Sound. We will study the extraordinary ecosystem that include saltwater fish, shore birds, marshes, and the sandy beaches of the Connecticut coast. We will take a trip to the Connecticut shore where we will get our feet wet and meet some of the people responsible for preserving one of our most valuable natural resources.

African Adventure July 27th – July 31st

Get ready to encounter the arid Sahara desert, the vast savannah, and the perilous jungle. We will learn about the wildlife found on the African continent and efforts to protect them. Our trek this week takes us to the Ecotarium in Worcester where we will see some endangered species.

A Trip Down Under August 3rd – August 7th

Discover how humans impact the interactions between plants and animals in the Australia outback and New Zealand biomes. We will learn about the incredible flora and fauna there and why so many of these species are facing extinction. Finish with a trip to the Roger Williams Zoo in Providence where we can see some of the endangered animals up close.

Storm Warning August 10th – August 14th

Buckle up! Rough weather ahead. You can expect to encounter hurricanes, blizzards, cyclones, and more as we learn about the effect that weather has on various parts of the world. We will find out how meteorologists predict weather and how weather patterns are changing over time. Our final trip for the summer takes us to the Museum of Science in Boston.
