Museum Visits

Scout groups are welcome to visit the museum during any public hours: Tuesday – Friday 9-5, Saturday & Sunday 12-5. Museum visits allow you unlimited time to explore the museum exhibits on your own. Currently the exhibits are "Connecticut Forests", "19th Century Manchester Farm Life", our miniature nature center, and our permanent live animal exhibit.

Adult chaperones will be admitted free if you call in advance and reserve a date and time. Children will be charged the regular admission of \$7.00. If staff is available, a short "Meet the Animal" program may be available. Please check when you call.

Museum Programs

Museum scout programs are approximately 45 minutes in length and are designed to help fulfill Daisy, Brownie, Junior, Cub, and Webelos scout requirements. Programs are offered at the Oak Grove Nature Center seasonally, and at the museum year round.

Programs are taught by experienced museum educators. Program dates are limited, so call the museum to schedule as early as possible. Some of the programs will be outdoors so please dress appropriately.

Current Programs Topics

Animals and Their Habitats Just like humans, wild animals also have needs and wants. Using our knowledge of our own backyards in Connecticut, we will learn what it takes for an animal to rise to the challenge for survival.

The Great Escape Ecosystems are the relationship that animals and plants have with their non-living counterparts like rocks, soil, and water. So, grab your pack, grab a friend, and let's build our own relationships with nature by learning all we can about the world out our window. It's time to hit the trails!

Outdoor Art Creator Nature often motivates artists to create what they see, hear, smell, and touch. Together, we'll walk the trails, explore our local wildlife, and see just how it can inspire us to create our own masterpieces.

Science Fanatics Answering challenging questions is no easy task, but when we put our minds to the test and use our senses to observe our surroundings, anything can be done! Let's grab our thinking caps, a pencil for notes, and begin the experiment!

Program Fees

Program fees are \$12 per scout. There is a minimum of 10 scouts required and a maximum of 25 scouts. If you are a small troop, you may want to have two troops come together. Adult leaders are free and are required to stay with the group.
